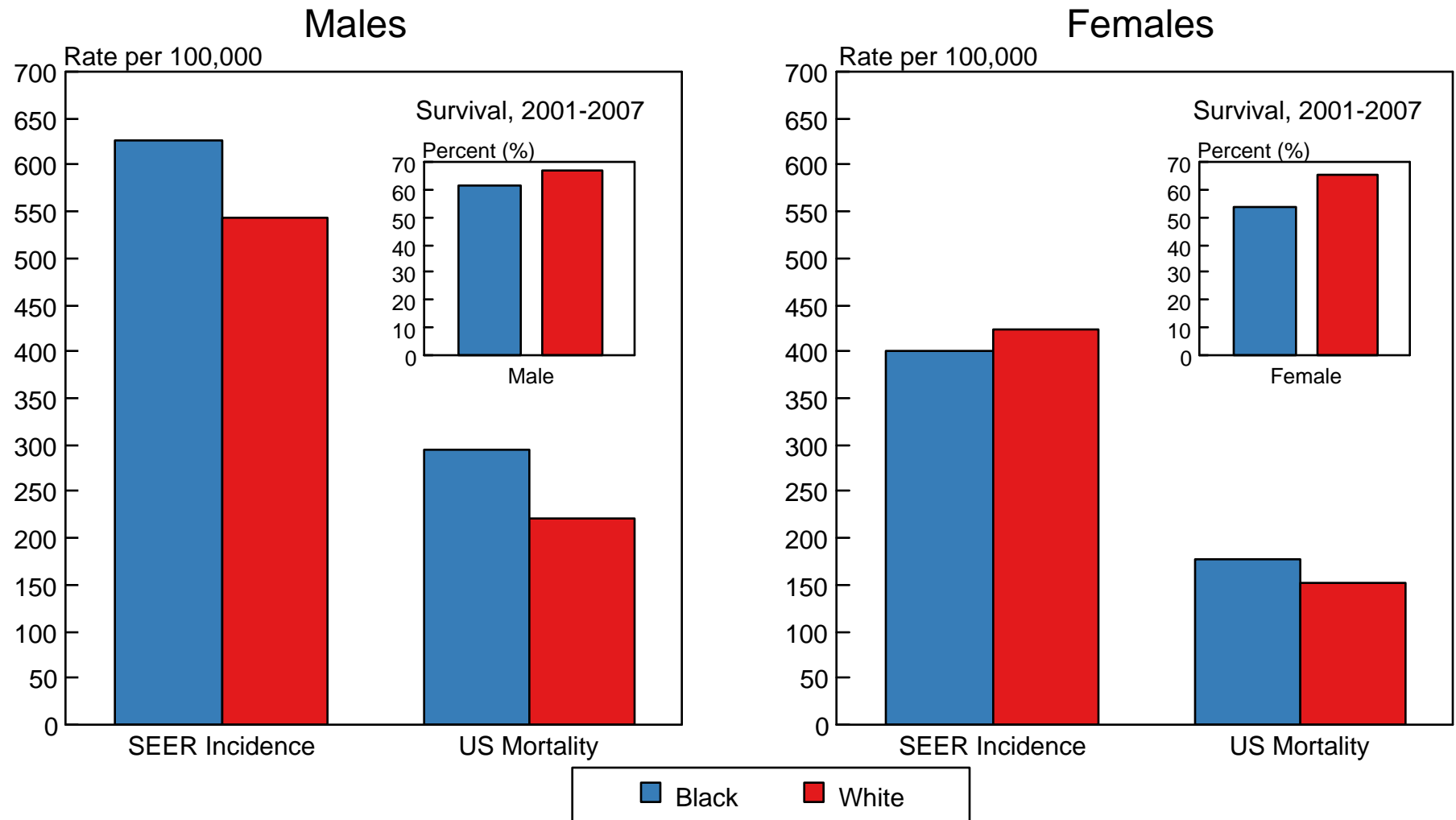
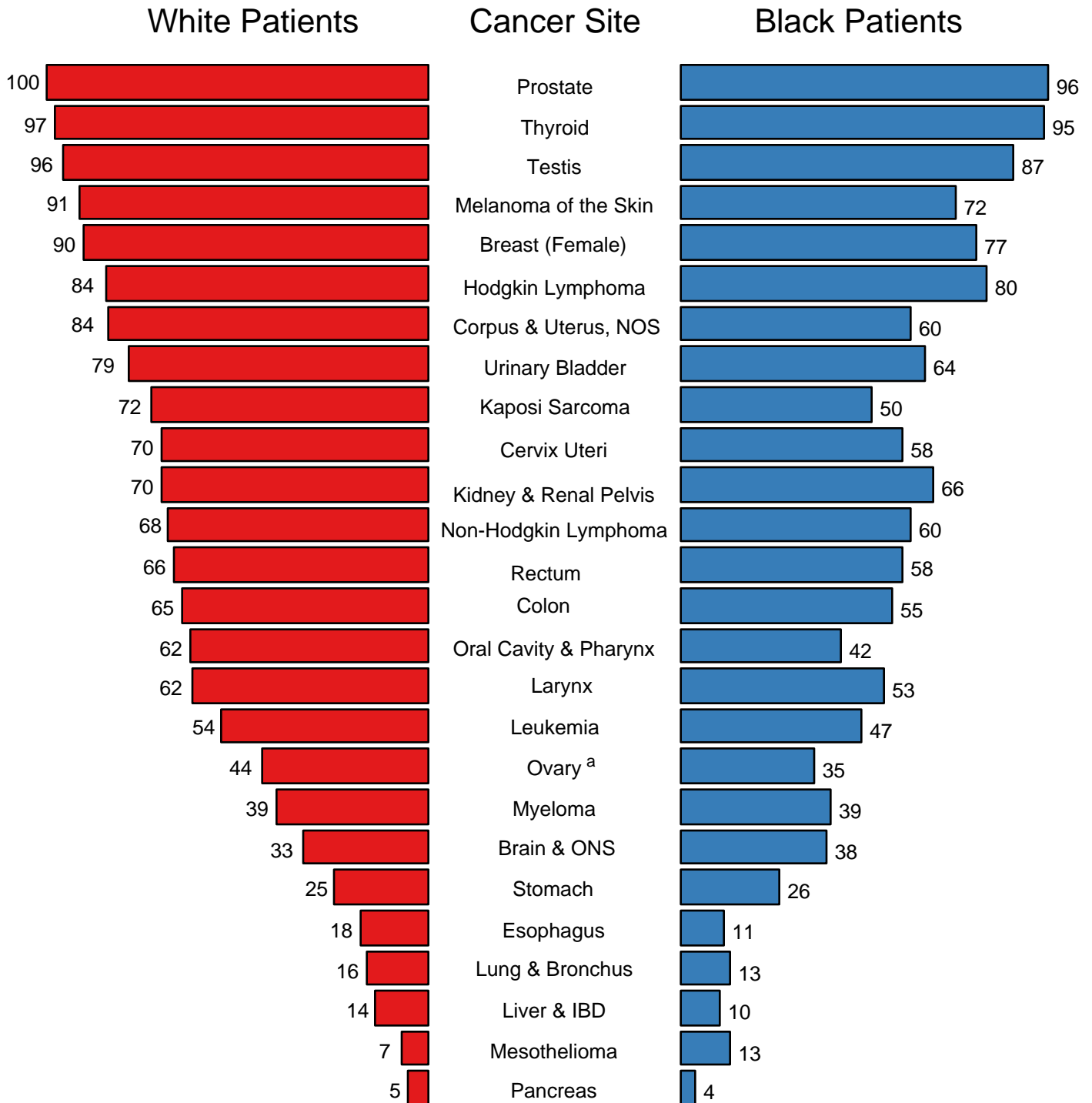

5-Year Relative Survival (%) SEER Program, 2001-2007 Both Sexes, by Race and Cancer Site

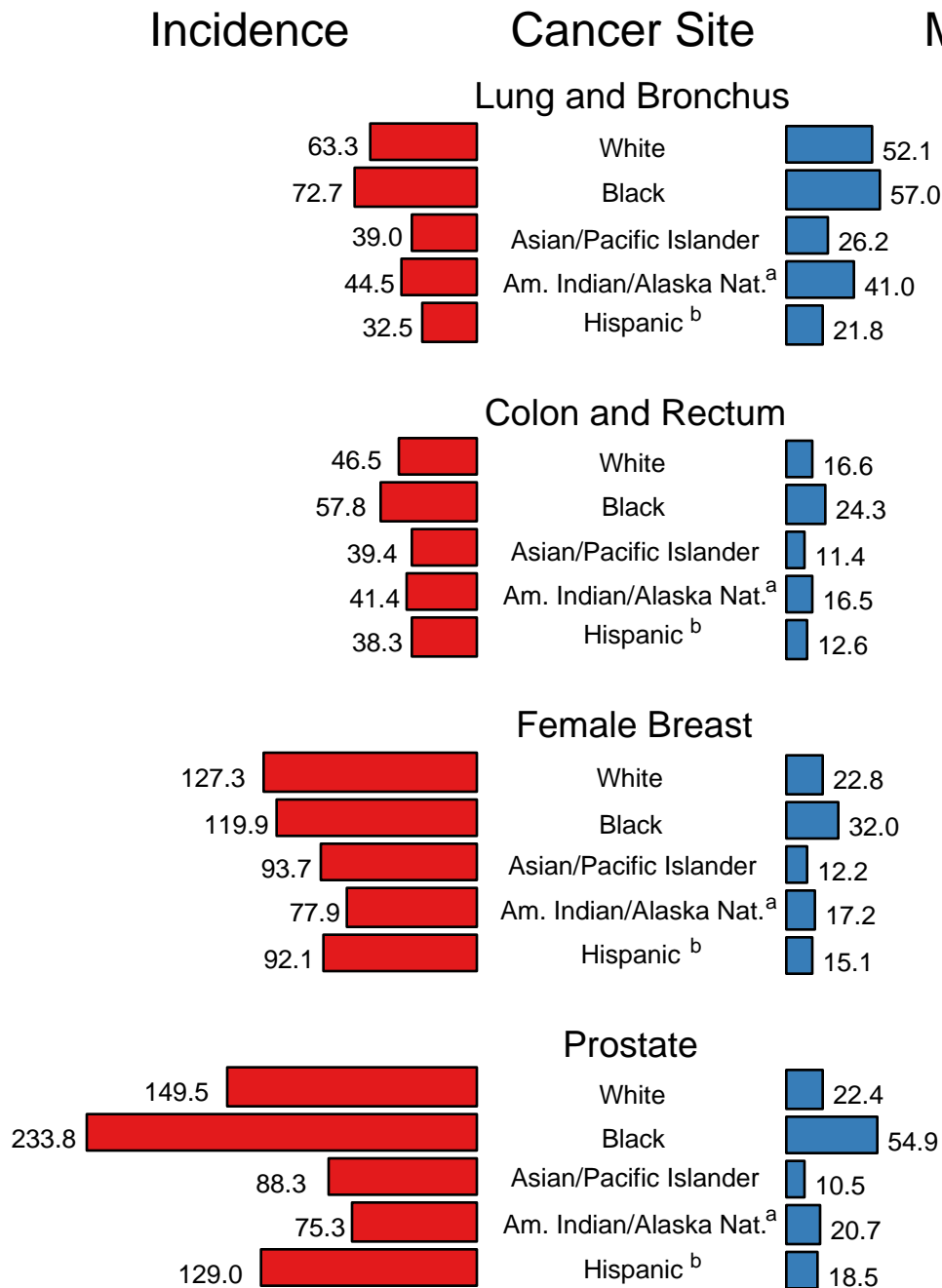
